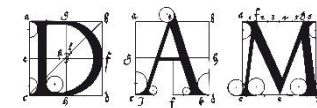

All the World's a Stage – Foyer on the upper floor

ALL THE WORLD'S A STAGE: COMPARING EUROPEAN THEATRES, OPERAS AND CONCERT HALLS is a unique exhibition from The Deutsches Architekturmuseum Frankfurt am Main (DAM) that reflects the situation of European theaters, opera houses and concert halls. The exhibition shows examples of successful renovations as well as spectacular new constructions, which in some cases act as catalysts for urban development.

It is not just the technical requirements and opportunities that are changing — the way performances are staged and what the public wants to see in cultural events are also in flux. The exhibition ALL THE WORLD'S A STAGE looks at comparable projects of recent years, both in Germany and in Europe. These include the restoration of historical buildings as well as spectacular new structures, which in some cases constitute landmarks in their respective urban setting.
