

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

DRAMATURGY FORUM

NATIONAL MORAVIAN-SILESIAN THEATRE, OSTRAVA 07-09 MARCH 2024

The Dramaturgy forum usually unites about 30 dramaturgs, colleagues from marketing, communication and education, artistic producers, artistic directors and intendants.

Participants are invited to embark on a four-day journey from Thursday 7 to Sunday 10 March. We will delve into the universe of Czech music as **Thursday** commences with an exploration, featuring presentations and a panel by Cezch opera makers.

On **Friday**, the group has the opportunity to partake in a unique excursion to Hukvaldy, Janacek's birthplace, to add to the thematic thread of Czech music.

On **Saturday**, delegates will approach the evolution of libretti to the performance texts, and discuss how to navigate the fine line between careful modernisation and suspected censorship. Each evening, an opera by Smetana promises to reflect these discussions.

On **Sunday** night, those still in town can watch *Libuše*.

From Prague Main Station, a fast-train to Ostrava runs 16 times a day. Direct flights to Ostrava from Vienna and Warsaw.



We will seize this opportunity to further amend them and include the perspective of touring companies and dance productions.

OPERA EUROPA'S DANCE FORUM

Opera Europa's first Dance event was hosted early November in the run-up to the Dance Brno festival, at the invitation of their Ballet Director Mario Radačovský.

With over 50 Ballet Artistic Directors and Managers, this meeting was a great way to open up discussions with a strong artistic force of over half of our member theatres.

The Ballet Administrators and the gathering of Ballet Directors convened by Ted Brandsen and Assis Carreiro of Positioning Ballet had joint meetings on common topics and parallel breakouts to address particular practical issues.

There was tremendous support for the creation of a Dance forum, but also the integration of dance in our other forums' discussions. Operabook will also integrate dance performances, in order to encourage production rentals and co-productions.

Members of the Dance forum will be welcome at our Artistic Administration & Producing forum in Zagreb, where coproductions hold the centre stage, and at our spring conference in Vienna, where the interactions between opera and ballet will be discussed.



From 2-4 November, almost 50 participants from 28 festivals and theatres from 17 countries came together in the picturesque surroundings of Perelada in the middle of olive groves on the Costa Brava.

Opera Europa's festival members were able to devote themselves entirely to the theme of the three days in an undisturbed thinktank environment: Are festivals the future of opera?

During the meeting, it became clear that on the one hand, festivals are the ideal holiday destination offering culture, nature and relaxation, which can also attract new audiences thanks to this overall package of experience. On the other hand, many festivals are highly specialised and therefore a place primarily for connoisseurs.

Above all, festivals differ from theatres in terms of their funding. While on average theatres in Europe receive around 70% of their funding from the public purse, the figure for festivals is barely 30%. This results in special attention for regular audiences and patrons, and the overall audience experience, which the festival's core team generally knows personally.

The meeting was topped off perfectly with a concert by the baroque band 'Tercia Realidad' in the castle church, a visit to the Dalì Museum in Figueres and some fine wines from the region. We hope to be back soon!
